


Why we Take Photos

Brain



A Camera has a lens and
A Light Sensitive Element
Image is Captured by
Film or Sensor




a Brief History of Photography

The Daguerreotype was the first publicly available photographic process.


It was widely used in the 1840's and 1850's


A Good Picture Has Several Qualities

The picture Should Show Something of Interest and Serve a Purpose

The picture grabs and holds the Viewer's Attention

The picture makes good use of Light, Color, Contrast, Focus

A Pretty Good picture can be Made Better or maybe even Great

When An Adventure Happens


Try to Capture the Best Moments in Photos

Later, Re-Review the Photos and Your Selection Choices

Resist the Temptation to Include Too Many Photos
Too Many Photos Dilute the Memories

After an Auto Accident, information can be exchanged by each party photographing the other driver's documents as well as the damages and surrounding area



If you need to file an insurance claim, having photos of the damage can be helpful.

Also, if you have jewelry, collectables, or other Valuable assets, a photographic inventory can document loss
